The foreign competitors and Chefs d'Equipe nominated by their National Federations will stay at Scandic Eremitage. Rooms are reserved by the Organizer from Wednesday May 13th to Sunday May 17th i.e. 5 single rooms for each team. A longer stay will be at the expense for those concerned. (Extras, drinks, telephone, etc. are not included).

Riders/Chef d'Equipes staying at a hotel or room other than the one selected by the Organizer or who do not accept the rules of the assigned hotel will have to pay all the expense incurred themselves. The rates at the hotel is euro 130, - for single rooms and euro 175, - for double rooms per night.

Breakfast is served at the hotel, other meals will be provided for riders and Chefs d'Equipe free of charge at the showground.

Room requests for chef's d'Equipe and team competitors may be submitted exclusively using the online system until the date of the definite entries on April 24th 2009.

Reservations for individual riders and people accompanying the riders must also be submitted with full name via the online entry system. Registrations received after April 24th 2008 are subject to availability.

2. GROOMS

Requests for accommodation must be sent with nominated entries.

Cost of accommodation will be at the cost of OC Athletes from May 13th to May 17th.

Meals: at OC Athletes expense from May 14th to May 17th

Grooms will get meal tickets for breakfast, lunch and dinner at the show ground. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

3. HORSES / PONIES

Transport expenses to be paid by the OC Athlete .

The horses will be stabled free of charge in Bernstorffsparken in loose boxes 3x3 m from Wednesday 13th May to Sunday 17th May. All bedding is free of charge. Hay, oats and shavings will be available, at the current daily price. Additional days Euro 35 per day per box

6. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES (Art. 136.1-2)

The Athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.1-2. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 136 of the General Regulations.

VI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS

Points system for qualification for class 10 and 11:

The 40 best horse/rider will receive points as follows: No. 1 - 40, No. 2 - 39 etc.

After the 3 classes the 30 best riders will qualify and each rider can start one horse, if a rider has qualified two horses, he may choose which one he will start.

2. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix. The 6 best in each class shall present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony.

3. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

There is no deductions from the prize money.

4. Credit cards

It will be possible to pay with credit cards (VISA/Master/Eurocard), but because of the extra costs from the card companies there will be an additional charge of 5.5% on payment with credit cards.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
